- Pray the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary as a family

- Please be advised: Earlier this month, during a Sunday 9 a.m. Mass at our parish, a car window was smashed and a purse and cell phone stolen from the vehicle. The news as well as our local law enforcement agencies have advised that theft is up at this time. Please take all valuables from your vehicle and do not leave things visible in your car. Be sure to lock your vehicles when away from them, even when attending Mass. Our prayers go out to the individual whose vehicle was targeted and a prayer for conversion of heart for those who committed the crime.

- First Friday Adoration is this week! Sign-up for an hour of Adoration or plan to stop in for a visit with our Lord on December 1. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament begins at the conclusion of the 9 a.m. Mass that day. Benediction will begin at 9:30 p.m.

This involves His "coming" to Jerusalem as the Shepherd who separates the faithful sheep of Israel from wicked goats. 2) He ultimately foretells the General Judgement at the end of history. This will involve Christ's Second Coming and the general resurrection of all people before His throne to be blessed or cursed according to their deeds. Mt. 25:31-46
