Pastor's Ponderings

- This Sunday is "Gaudete Sunday," which takes its name from the Latin word for 'Rejoice!' Have you ever noticed in the evening, or early in the morning, as the sun sets and rises, the beautiful colors giving way to pinks and purples (ROSE), letting us know of the conclusion of one day and the beginning of another? This is a very visual image for the purpose of our rose vestments this weekend, in the midst of the Advent purple. I am reminded of a verse from one of our Advent hymns: "The king shall come when morning dawns, and light triumphant breaks, when beauty gilds the eastern hills, and life to joy awakes." Advent is preparing us in the watching and the waiting, to make straight the Lord's path in our life and to welcome with joy his coming in history, at Mass in mystery, and one day in glory. Sometimes, the watching and waiting seems long, and cold, and even at times dark, in the spiritual life. But "Gaudete Sunday" reminds us that the Lord is true to His word and that we have reason to rejoice! We are almost to Christmas, but it is still Advent for now.

- This Tuesday, December 19, is our ADVENT CONFESSAPALOOZA from 5:30-7:30 p.m. (an opportunity to drop by, confess - with several priests available - and then stay and pray or leave for those who must).

- Our Advent/Christmas Novena has begun! We will be praying each evening between 6:30 and 7 in the main church.

- As previously announced, we will offer three parish Masses to celebrate the Nativity of Our Lord this year. Please notice that the Christmas Eve Mass for families will be at 6 p.m.; the Midnight Mass will be in English this year (Latin last year); and the 10 a.m. Mass will be in Latin this year (English last year).

- THANK YOU to those who participated in our Sunday Mass Times survey this past weekend. We have had the survey available the last two weekends now, and the total results of the survey are as follows: 101 responded "*Current Mass Times meet my/our needs*"; 18 responded "*9 a.m. Mass moved to 8 a.m.*"; 39 responded "*9 a.m. Mass moved to 10:30 a.m.*"; 87 responded "*I would like to see current 9 a.m. Mass dropped and return to 8 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. Masses.*" This information will be reviewed and discussed at Parish Council as we go forward and consider any possible changes or adjustments.

- Our Director of Social Ministry and Family Life for the diocese, Nicholas Lund-Molfese, would like to invite all Catholic families and individuals to the Homeless Persons Memorial Service. This event will take place at the Gathering Tree, 634 W. Wall St., Springfield, MO 65806 this weekend (Sun., Dec. 17, 6-7:30 p.m.). The event is intended to be a recognition of homeless individuals who have died on our streets and is hosted on or near the longest night of the year. The event is free and will be held by candlelight. Last year, Bishop Rice attended and found it both "respectful and moving."

- Congratulations to our Knights of Columbus for hosting an excellent breakfast last weekend that was well-attended and delicious!
