Pastor's Ponderings

- Thank you, once again, to Frs. Oliver Clavin and Joseph Kelly for celebrating Masses at St. Joseph the Worker last weekend, through this past week, and again this weekend. Fr. Oliver is a retired priest of the diocese, residing in Springfield currently, and assisting in area parishes as requested. He is originally from Ireland and spent a number of years as pastor at St. Augustine in Kelso. Fr. Kelly was born and raised in the Springfield area and is currently in his second assignment as an Associate Pastor serving in Branson (Our Lady of the Lake) and Forsyth (Our Lady of the Ozarks). Fr. Kelly is the brother of J.B. Kelly of our parish staff.

- Annually, priests are expected to take time in retreat and prayer in order to better listen to the Lord and work on their interior life and formation. I recently spent some time on silent retreat and appreciate the prayers offered for me while I was away. Please know that you were in my prayers, too!

- Now seems a good time to remind folks that if you are ill with coughing, fever, runny nose, or flu-like symptoms, it is a good and prudent decision to stay home and get better rather than coming to Mass and running the chance of making others sick. No one wants to miss Mass, and certainly no one wants to get sick in coming to Mass. Please also know that should someone decline the 'Sign of Peace' to shake hands, it may be because they feel ill, or are coming down with something, or are observing caution themselves. Remember that should you be ill or feel ill at Mass, one may want to reserve reception of the Precious Blood if it seems appropriate to do so. The cold and flu season is upon us and experts tell us that it's a particularly heavy one this season. By taking a few simple and thoughtful precautions, we can remain well and keep others well, too. Ultimately, it all rests in the Lord's hands, but doing what we can rests with us. Please, also, do not leave used tissues in the pews or in the bookholders. Thanks for your understanding and attention to these matters.

- We would like to welcome to the parish those who have recently joined. We have had several families and a few individuals recently come to be with us. In the coming bulletins of February, we will be highlighting some of these new parish family members. Keep an eye out to greet and welcome any new faces you might see in the vestibule and before and after Mass. The family that prays together not only stays together, but grows together.
