

Sacraments

ADORATION: The Blessed Sacrament is exposed on First Fridays from 9:30 a.m. until Benediction at 9:30 p.m.

BAPTISM OF INFANTS: Preparation classes for registered parishioners are scheduled as-needed. Expectant parents or parents of newborns can register for a class by contacting the parish office or emailing sjwdre@saintjosephozark.org.

BAPTISM OF ADULTS: Please contact the parish office to arrange for participation in RCIA.

MARRIAGE PREPARATION: Our diocesan policy requires the parish priest be contacted at least six months prior to the *proposed* date of the couples' wedding to schedule preparation catechesis.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: If facing serious illness, please contact the parish office to arrange for anointing.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION, FIRST SACRAMENTS, CONFIRMATION: We currently offer a "whole-family catechesis" program for families and sacramental preparation classes on select Sundays.

CHANGE IN CONFIRMATION POLICY

Our diocese will now be extending the invitation to be Confirmed to those in 7th-9th grades. Families with students currently in 6th-8th grades should begin ensuring that their children attend on-site classes at the parish as part of their sacramental preparation (remaining classes this semester: April 8 and April 22) for Confirmation in 2020. To date, the middle school students have already begun instruction on the Church's teachings from Canon Law and the Catechism about Confirmation, as well as the Gifts of the Holy Spirit.
