

#### Pastor's Ponderings

- Mary as "Mother of the Church" has a long history and deep Scripture roots. In February 2018 the announcement was made by the Congregation of Divine Worship and Discipline of the Sacraments (CDW) that a feast day to recognize Mary under the title of "Mother of the Church" would be celebrated everywhere the Monday after Pentecost on the Church calendar. In honor and recognition of what has always been but is now given a special day of attention, pamphlets are available in the back of church located on the circular table of the vestibule. They do a very nice job of describing this special day and the foundations for it. Cardinal Robert Sarah, prefect of the CDW, announced this special feast honoring the Blessed Mother. With May being the month of Mary, and Mother's Day having just occurred, let us take a little time to celebrate well and consider the blessing of this new feast.
- Thank you to all those who have already responded to the DDF via the mailing that many received at their home or, for newer parishioners, the pew cards. DDF is in its early period this year, but it's not too early to consider what return in prayer and offering you and your family might make to support the Bishop's vital ministries around the diocese and in our parishes. If you have not already given, please take a moment to prayerfully consider how you will participate this year. Thanks again to our DDF chairpersons, Ron Rinke, Diane Rinke, and Kathleen McGuire.
- Please keep in prayer all those preparing for Confirmation on Saturday, June 2, at the 4 p.m. Vigil Mass. Senior Will Hansen received the sacrament at the Easter Vigil, and Dylan Copeland will be Confirmed this Sunday, May 20 (Pentecost). May God bless these young Catholic Christians as they are sealed, or have been sealed, with the Gifts of the Holy Spirit. Please also pray for our First Communicants, who will receive the Holy Eucharist for the first time on Sunday, June 3.
- Thank you to all the mothers and families who attended the Masses and breakfast this past weekend. It was a joy to celebrate the Ascension of Our Lord and the blessing of motherhood in our families. St. Therese of Lisieux is quoted as saying, "The loveliest masterpiece of the heart of God is the love of a mother."
- Starting on the 27<sup>th</sup> of May, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, we will begin offering the Prayer to St. Michael following the final blessing and before the recessional of the Mass. 
